We are following up on our previous letter about Mount Sinai's conversations with your insurance provider, Cigna. We are working to reach new agreements that protect your access to care before our contract expires on Friday, January 31. While we intend to reach an agreement before our contract expires, we wanted to share important information about your potential rights to in-network access to Mount Sinai if we are unable to reach an agreement.

Continuity of Care

If you are being treated for certain health conditions, Cigna is legally required to continue to cover your treatment for that condition at Mount Sinai for a period of time through continuity of care benefits. **Based on our review of your records, we believe you or your child may be eligible for these benefits.**

Examples of conditions covered by continuity of care may include:

- Pregnancy
- Newly diagnosed cancer and currently receiving chemotherapy, radiation therapy, or reconstruction
- Relapsed cancer and currently receiving chemotherapy, radiation therapy, or reconstruction
- Transplant candidates or recipients in need of ongoing care due to complications
- Recent major surgeries in the acute phase
- Serious acute conditions in active treatment (e.g., heart attacks or strokes)
- Other serious chronic conditions that require active treatment

We encourage you to call Cigna at the number on the back of your insurance ID card to learn more about how to apply for the benefit.
